STEPS FOR SUCCESSFUL CUB SCOUT RECRUITING

SIMPLE INSTRUCTIONS FOR RUNNING A CUB RECRUITING EVENT

1. Set a date and location. The best locations are the school from which you're (primarily) recruiting, or your chartered partner's location. Make sure you have permission for the event way in advance and get ready to publicize the event.
2. Order your flyers and yards signs from the council office. Identify locations for the yard signs and locations to distribute the flyers.
3. Make sure you have a fun activity for the youth (30 to 45 minutes) and a separate area to talk to the parents. Get your den chiefs or other parents to staff this area.
4. Recruit your Lion and Tiger Den Leaders early. Get a parent that is familiar with the other families from school. This will help to allay any fears the new parents might have.
5. Assemble a packet of information for the parents. Make sure you include the next year's calendar, permission forms, dues information, uniform information, and a copy of the mini *Boy's Life*.
6. Publicize your event. Church bulletins, school mailings, PTA meetings, supermarkets, pediatricians' offices, local newspapers, and other civic organizations are great places to start.
7. Make sure the youth are having fun. A well-planned activity will ensure that their first exposure to Cub Scouting is a positive one, and they will want to return for more.
8. Make the sale to the parents. Use a script; keep it simple, and then mingle with the parents to answer their questions. Don't extend the meeting with a group Q&A session; instead, answer questions individually, and make sure other "seasoned" parents are there to help as they tell their great experiences with Scouting. Have pictures of pack activities displayed, or running on a loop on a computer or projected onto a screen.
9. Get the applications signed that night. Have a pack event scheduled very close to the recruiting event to invite the new Scouts to and make it clear that they need to be registered to attend. Collect the applications and turn them in to the scout council office the same week.
10. Follow-up! If parents are hesitant to sign up that night, follow up with them within a few days. Have the Lion and Tiger Den Leaders do the follow-up, especially if the families know each other.
11. Get all the new Cubs together for Lion and Tiger events. Make sure it's fun and keeps them active so they'll want to come back.
12. Follow-up with your new Lion and Tiger Den Leaders to make sure the Scouts stay engaged and continue to have fun. Monitor attendance and advancement, two key indicators of a successful program. Keep it fun!



Cub Scout Recruiting – Make an Impression That Will Last!

Every fall we see the look in thousands of young faces as they sign up to be a Scout. We all have seen that face, full of excitement and anticipation sparked by promises of adventure. So, our first step to making a difference in a youth's life is to enroll them as a member.

Youth join our organization to have fun (and develop life skills) and they stay in our program because they are engaged in enjoyable activities. **Our challenge is to make a good first impression at one of the most important nights in a Scout's career – the School Night.** It is on this night that the families are introduced to Scouting and it's our responsibility to make this night special.

At your district's school night training, your unit received a packet of resources that will help you plan a GREAT fall membership drive and school night.

Included with the packet are two very useful items. The **“Official Tool Kit for Packs”** includes sample press releases, flyers, timelines, samples letters, job descriptions (for school night chairs), and the Pack Round-up Agenda. The **“Cub Scout Den Leader Kit”** will help you support new and existing den leaders. This folder includes a welcome to new den leaders, ideas for the first two months, Program Helps, yearly planner, resource listings, and Cub Scouting Highlights.

After looking at your packets, you may feel a little overwhelmed with all the information and resources available. However, if you focus on the following topics, you will have a great fall recruitment campaign:

Orientation

Unit leaders involved with school nights should be familiar with available resources.

Planning

Work with your district membership committee, district executive and Pack committee to design your fall recruitment campaign.

Marketing

Make an attempt at 7 contacts for your audience. This can include school presentations, flyers, yard signs, billboards, press releases to local newspapers, bring-a-friend, and advertising in a church bulletins.

Leadership Inventory

Take a look at your pack and identify vacant positions. Write a job description for each (see Cub Scout Leader Handbook for samples). What qualities should these leaders possess? Use this information to help identify new leader prospects. Remember, recruiting one-on-one is better than recruiting in a group setting such as school night.

Incentives

Use incentives to create excitement. This year, the Council will provide each new youth who joins Scouts a Lego Creator set. Your Pack could develop its own incentive plan for parents who become new leaders!

The School Night

Make this night special. Following an agenda to explain Scouting in general, importance of parental involvement, finances, divide parents/youth into their dens and discuss their specific program, discuss leadership vacancies and talk about their job descriptions, collect registration, and announce follow-up meetings.

Follow-up

Hold a parents meeting within a week of your School Night to finalize leadership recruiting, invite new leaders to training, announce the next Pack meeting and other up-coming activities. Hold another school night if the first did not meet your recruiting expectations.

Have Fun!!!

Remember, in order to gain the benefits of Scouting, youth must first join the organization. It's our role as leaders to develop a sound plan to ensure that youth have a quality Scouting experience and that quality experience starts with the sign-up night!

Pack Roundup Night Coordinator Checklist MAKE YOUR FIRST IMPRESSION EXCITING

Before you Leave Home

- Prepare your pre-opening activity
- Wear your uniform
- Review agenda and practice your presentation
- Take a pocket calculator
- Take 20-30 pens and/or pencils
- Take some change, both bills and coins
- Take masking tape

Also Bring for Display

- Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, & Webelos Books
- Your Round-up Night packet of materials
- A copy of Boys' Life magazine
- A copy of Program Helps
- A copy of Cub Scout Leader Book
- A copy of How-To Book
- Pack/Council Annual Calendar

Arrive at the School - at least 30 minutes before start time:

- Organize your materials and setup room.
- Check with other team members (including unit leaders) on their part of the program.
- Post your pack organizational chart.
- Assist unit leaders with their displays.
- Organize your pre-opening activity.
- Station either yourself or another team member at the door to serve as greeter. Have parents sign-in on attendance rosters, give them a Parent's Orientation Guide, and welcome families to your Round-up Night.
- Youth and parents should sit together by grade.

The General Presentation

- Begin promptly at your start time.
- Present opening ceremony by pack (or a troop).
- Introduce yourself and welcome everyone on behalf of Minsi Trails Council, Boy Scouts of America.
- Follow the Round-up Night agenda carefully.

Be sure to turn in all applications, monies, and attendance rosters to your District Round-up Team Member.

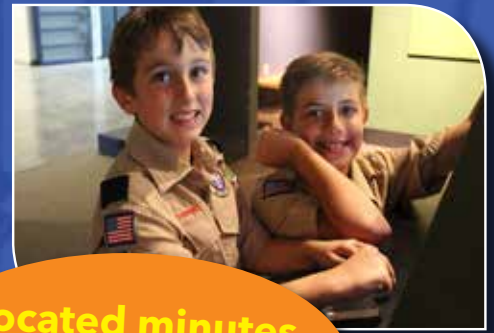

 - Give each family a Parent Orientation Guide AND Pack Annual Calendar
 - Seat families by grade
- 7:30 P.M. **Opening Ceremony**
- Conduct a simple ceremony using current Cub Scouts or Scouts BSA youth
 - Introductions of current leaders
 - Welcome families and thank them for coming
 - Have the youth go with another leader for a fun activity so that you can inform the parents about Cub Scouts
- 7:40 P.M. **Presentation to Parents**
- Explain Cub Scouts to the parents
 - Joining Requirements
 - Activities
 - Rank Advancement
 - *Boy's Life*
 - Fees (Registration and Dues)
 - Uniform
 - Answer questions at the end of your presentation
- 8:00 P.M. **Reassemble the Group, Form Dens, Recruit other Volunteers**
- Select leaders for each den
 - Recruit volunteers and helpers
 - Schedule den meetings
 - Collect forms and fees
 - Conclude the meeting
- 8:30 P.M. **Brief Meeting with New Leaders**

One other possible part to consider adding is "The Light of the Eagle" ceremony. It involves a large box (2 feet x 3 feet) which has a lighted front section with an Eagle badge on it. The individual sections of the badge can be lighted individually. A ceremony that explains the significance of each section of the badge is provided.
