About Nomadic

Nomadic life thrives in summer and survives in winter. Considering climatic conditions, especially during winter, such lifestyle may seem to the outside world to be a very hard way of living.

However, Mongolians have developed for centuries such qualities as strength and resilience that are essential for survival in this harsh nature, which is their cherished homeland.

Nomadic families often gathered in groups move generally in the radius of 50 to 100 kilometers, at least twice a year, in spring (May) and at the beginning of winter (October). However, more significant displacements are sometimes necessary in the search of better pastures.

Nomads devote all of the day to caring after their animals – watching over, milking, shearing, or combing – to produce felt and felt clothes, cheese and other dairy products. Horses are raised and looked after by men but are milked by women.

Eligibility

Participants and Unit Leaders

Male and female Scouts aged 12 to 17 years old at the start of the Jamboree are eligible to take part in 3IAPRSJ as participants. A unit will consist of 4 patrols, with each patrol consisting of 9 Scouts and an adult leader. Therefore, a unit will consist of 4 adult leaders and 36 Scouts.

Contingent Management Team (CMT)

Each national contingent will form a team of adult leaders to support the participants. CMT would place headquarter in the jamboree site and will stay at the adult camp area. Advised size of the CMT is shown below

International Service Team (IST)

In order to make Jamboree happen we need about 1,000 members of the International Service Team (IST). Scouts who are at least 18 years of age at the start of the Jamboree are welcome to join the IST, and help to make the Jamboree happen. IST should be able to communicate in English and be ready to perform any tasks necessary for the Jamboree. In addition, they must attend the Jamboree as part of a National Contingent.

Jamboree Planning Team

We are currently recruiting member of the Jamboree Planning Team (JPT), which supports the planning of the Jamboree.

Jamboree Planning Team is open to experienced volunteers willing to advice voluntary during the planning phase of the Jamboree with his or her expertise. All applications must come through their NSO.

Access to the Jamboree Site

Chinggis Khaan International Airport will be the main points of entry by air. You can also arrive Ulaanbaatar Station by train.

Plan your trip reach to in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia by direct flight from Istanbul (Turkey), Berlin (Germany), Moscow (Russia), Seoul (Korea), Osaka and Tokyo (Japan), Hong Kong and Beijing (China) and train from Moscow (Trans Siberian Train) and Beijing.





The Jamboree Site

The 31st Asia Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree will be held the Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.

Mongolia is a landlocked country in east-central Asia. It is bordered by Russia to the north and China to the south, east and west. Ulaanbaatar, the capital and also the largest city, is home to about 45% of the population. Mongolia's political system is a parliamentary republic.

Ulaanbaatar is located at about 1,350 meters (4,430 ft) above mean sea level, slightly east of the centre of Mongolia on the Tuul River, a sub tributary of the Selenge, in a valley at the foot of the mountain Bogd Khan Uul. Ulaanbaatar is noted for its extreme isolation

The Jamboree Site: Nairamdal

Nairamdal is located in 27 kilometers from Ulaanbaatar city, capital of Mongolia.

The ICC “Nairamdal” is a governmental children’s organization, under the supervision of the Ministry of Human Development and Social Welfare of Mongolia, which welcomes 20 000 children and youth from native and foreign countries for 3-10 days in its 40 shifts offering various development programs for them in order to discover their skills and talents and ensure their participation.

Climate

Mongolia’s land of temperature extremes. The average annual temperature in Mongolia ranges from -16°C (-2°F) in February to a more comfortable 16°C (62°F) in July. Summer fades quickly, and by September the annual average temperature drops to 8°C (48°F)





The Jamboree Programme

The 31st Asia Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree program highlights are a chance to Mongolian and overseas participants to exchange their experiences and to let scouts learn about Mongolian culture and history. There will be various kinds of interesting activities organized every day.

We would like to give everyone as much opportunity as possible to meet people from other cultures and from the local community, as well as to enable them to participate in interesting and stimulating activities.

Module Activity

Nomadic Centre

In this center you will have an opportunity to introduce with specific about Mongolian nomadic lifestyle.

Nomadic life thrives in summer and survives in winter. Considering climatic conditions, especially during winter, such lifestyle may seem to the outside world to be a very hard way of living. Also you will have an opportunity to play traditional games, songs and dances. Traditional games such as ankle bone, archery and putting up a Mongolian ger, riding a horse and two-hump camel, and etc.

All participants will have a chance to take part in the traditional manly sports at Naadam Festival such as Wrestling, Archery and Horse racing.



Scout Centre

It will be centre for learning and improving your skill of Pioneering, craft workshops, hiking around resort area, mountain trail encircling the jamboree and orienteering. Also providing opportunity to practice friendship and become Messenger of Peace.

The Global Development Village Centre

GDV will be an on-site module programme, which tries to raise awareness over global issues such as peace, environment, development, human rights and health allows participants to become active members of the global community through various exhibits, games, arts and audio-visual displays, discussions, and presentations.





Head of Contingents Meeting

Another opportunity to see the Jamboree site is the Heads of Contingents Meeting. In July 2015, we will hold the first Heads of Contingents Meeting, which is a formal briefing event with the Jamboree Organization. This is your opportunity to visit the Jamboree site and ask question regarding the programme, logistics, and so on. The fee and application will be announced in later Bulletins.

Study Visit at the pre -31 APR Scout Jamboree

There will be several opportunities to visit Jamboree site before 2017. The detail such as fee and date will be announced in the later Bulletin. Study visit could be training, jamboree, camp, exchange programmes.
